PRESIDENT'S REPORT ROTARY YEAR 2021-22

Introduction

The Rotary International theme for the 2021/22 was "Serve to Change Lives":



SERVE TO CHANGE LIVES

This was a powerful theme and I believe the Rotary Club of Kowloon North contributed significantly towards accomplishing the goals envisaged by it.

With the hope that pandemic would be soon behind us, my year as President started with great anticipation of a fruitful year and a fresh start. It was expected that Rotary Clubs around the world would be able to resume normal Club activities and take part in service projects. How mistaken I was! We started the first Board Meeting with a fire scare at my office and we were still plagued by the pandemic for the majority of 2022.

Though the Rotary year of 2021-22 was not without its challenges and obstacles, our Club persevered as always and looking back, we achieved a considerable amount during the year.

Rotaract Club

We held the installation of Charter President Yumi of the Rotaract Club of Kowloon North (a Rotaract Club sponsored by our Club) on 2nd July 2022. This marked the formal chartering of our Club's newest Rotaract Club. We had around 30 people in attendance, including IPDG Eric Chak, PDG Ada Cheng and District officials from both Rotary and Rotaract Clubs, members friends and family. Our own charter member Gary Harilela also attended to support our young Rotaractors.



Projects and Service

Rotary x Hub Vision Screening Day on 31st October 2021

Our Club was proud to resume its vision screening project, this time in Hong Kong. Together with the Hub, we have organized a vision screening day for the children at the Hub on 31st October 2021. This is a meaningful project, especially since children nowadays are facing eyesight problems from the increased usage of electronic products to study at home during the pandemic.

We mobilized a total 33 volunteers (not including the volunteers from the vision department of Polytechnic University) to serve throughout the day and served close to 200 children that day, prescribing them with new spectacles.



Christina Noble Children's Fund - Child Sponsorships

Our Club members sponsored 19 children's living and educational expenses with the CNCF in Outer Mongolia in the total amount of HK\$126,900. Since this initiative was started 19 years ago, the Club has donated a highly impressive total HK\$3,369,979.60, comprising of HK\$2,482,250.00 for the education of under privileged children plus HK\$857,278.40 medical and healthcare of such children.

Food Angels service

During months in which food service was available, our Club sent out teams of volunteers to the food preparation centre of Food Angels to serve food to the elderly or pack food boxes. A total of 4 volunteering sessions were attended by our Club this Rotary year.



RC Golden Bauhinia x RC Kowloon North x The Hub HK Cyberport Visit on 29th December 2021 @ CyberPort

Our Club partnered with RC Golden Bauhinia and The Hub HK to organize the visit to the Cyberport for 24 kids of the Hub. It was their first time there and truly an eye-opener and a fascinating experience for them.



<u>Area 7 - Joint project: LOVE & CARE FROM ROTARY 3450「健康傳耆顯愛心」on 7th - 14th May 2022 @ Ngau Tau Kok and Sau Mau Ping</u>

Our Club is proud to be a part of the Area 7 joint project for the donation of "lucky bags" to the elderly living in the Ngai Tau Kok and Sau Mau Ping area, where it is far from supermarkets. Throughout the week, we mobilized volunteers from our Club to pack the bags and personally deliver them to the elderly. The bags were loaded with goodies and contained necessities such as rice, canned foods, testing kits and exercise tools. In the end, we delivered lucky bags to 349 elderly people in the area. A key message of the project was the promotion of the importance of regular exercise to the elderly whilst being confined to their homes during the pandemic – the bags contained instructional pamphlets on exercises that could be done at home.



The Rotary Foundation

Each member of the Club has donated US\$100 per year (EREY) to the Rotary Foundation to support Polio Eradication. Members who donated a total of US\$1,000 become a Paul Harris Fellow and receive a special pin in recognition.

COVID Relief

Vaccination days and campaigns

Doctors of our Club, Angela Wong and Francis Chu, volunteered at the Rotary COVID Pandemic Campaign on 7-9 January 2022 and gave medical advice to vaccination receivers at Wong Tai Sin. Angela Wong volunteered again at the Vaccination Day hosted by RC Kai Tak on 19-20 February 2022 and this time she helped give vaccinations to members of the public. These were important works which helps both the people being vaccinated and the rest of the community.



Donation of testing kits to the Hub

With the co-ordination from Josephine and donations from our members, our Club purchased and donated 3,400 testing kits to the HUB which were distributed to families and children of the centre.



Fellowships

Fellowship Pub Quiz Night on 30th July 2021 @ Bar Ares

Fun night of drinking, eating and quizzes. We had 20 people attending, including friends and family and Rotaractors. Under President Gordon's leadership and with his immense general knowledge, Team "Stupid" achieved the lowest score among the 5 teams and was the only team awarded the Wooden Spoon prize.
